PROGNOSES CITE FAVOURITES FOR NOBEL PEACE PRIZE DESPITE 273 CANDIDATES LISTED

2015 IS HIGHLY LOADED WITH NEWS

USPA NEWS - The Nobel Peace Prize 2015 is awarded Friday, October 9, to "the person who in the preceding year shall have done the most the best work for fraternity between nations, for the abolition or reduction of standing armies and for the holding and promotion of peace congresses, said Alfred Nobel.

POTENTIAL WINNERS OF NOBEL PEACE PRIZE ARE VARIOUS AND FIGHT FOR PEACE-----

According to Nobel's will, "the Peace Prize shall be awarded to the person who in the preceding year "shall have done the most or the best work for fraternity between nations, for the abolition or reduction of standing armies and for the holding and promotion of peace congresses". Each year, the Norwegian Nobel Committee specifically invites qualified people to submit nominations for the Nobel Peace Prize. The statutes of the Nobel Foundation specify categories of individuals who are eligible to make nominations for the Nobel Peace Prize.-----

Because of the hard breaking news of this year, The Nobel Committee could also have addressed the issue of refugees. The chancellor Merkel is also cited for her courage and the prompt manner in which she handled the crisis of migrants, hosting more than 1 million refugees mainly from Syria. She was the first political leader to react officially by offering the 'right of asylum "a" anyone migrant fleeing Syria for reasons of conflict of war, would be regularised in Germany, even if the first ground is that of France or England or other "She thus took the risk of breaking the application of the Dublin agreements where the rule of the regularisation applies for political asylum in the first country where a refugee arrives.

This would imply that German Chancellor Angela Merkel is also praised for her role in the Ukrainian crisis (In Format Normandie with President Hollande to reach peace in Ukraine) could be honoured according to the bookmakers. However when answering a journalist at the Format Normandie Press Conference in Paris, last Friday Angela Merkel said " I'm not looking for peace in the Nobel Prize, I'm already busy enough in finding solutions on the ground".

The UN High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) or good Samaritans like Mussie Zerai Eritrean priest and mayor of the Italian island of Lampedusa, Giusi Nicolini, are also cited.

Other applications include regulars, like Pope Francis, for his commitment to social justice and the environment, and the doctor Denis Mukwege, who treats women raped in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).

This year the Nobel committee has decided not to reward a political figure, as it was in 2009, awarding the US President Obama "for his extraordinary efforts in favour of strengthening international diplomacy and cooperation between peoples", said the jury prize Oslo, and the European Union in 2012. This year in this period of turmoil in the world, the most intimate prestigious jury committee, decided to congratulate the civil society who advances increasingly as a rampart of violence derivatives related to dictatorships or terrorism. This bodes may be a new era, a time when our planet is suffering from climate change, the upheaval of the world stage, with the multiplication of armed conflict or civil war, or more sadly under the yoke of terrorists. This was the case in Syria, including 1/4 of the population was exiled as migration to a better life in Europe-----

In fact Obama has launched calls for a world without nuclear weapons that ended with a nuclear deal with Iran, became historic on 2 April 2015 (voted at the congress in 58-42 on September 10); and the restoration of relations between the US and Cuba (July 20th, after 54 years of cold war) another symbolically strong and another historic moment. Obama's approach of diplomacy, consensus and the method used of a so American "win win", has "created a new climate in international politics", said the president of the Norwegian

Nobel Committee, Thorbjorn Jagland.-----
